CLASSES ELIGIBLE: 2-9

RULES:

See General Fair Rules in front section of this book.

1. Floral building will open to the public on Thursday.
2. All horticulture entries will be received Wednesday from 6 PM - 9 PM and Thursday from 7 AM - 8:30 AM.
3. **Entries received after 8:30 AM on Thursday may be displayed, but will not be judged.**
4. Danish system of judging will be used. Each exhibit will be judged on its own merit.
5. All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor, except in the Decorative Design Division.
6. Identify or name your exhibit as specifically as possible as this is highly educational to the viewing public and a credit in judging.
7. Any entry having an IMPROPERLY FILLED IN ENTRY form will be DISQUALIFIED.
8. **It is requested that anyone bringing numerous entries, please fill out entry forms ahead of time. Forms and exhibitor numbers are available at the Fair Office.**
9. Exhibitors must furnish and be responsible for their own containers in Decorative Design Division. Accessories may be used in any Decorative Design lot.
10. No artificial flowers or foliage (e.g., plastic, silk, etc.) may be used in flower arrangements.
11. Please keep arrangements in SHOW CONDITION through end of show by replacing any wilted flowers/ foliage as necessary.
12. Department Superintendent reserves the right to remove from display any exhibit or part thereof, which is not kept up to SHOW QUALITY.
13. Fair will provide glass containers for Division 2, Section 1-21.

AWARDS:

**Blue, Red, and White awards will be given in each section or lot where warranted.
If an exhibit is unworthy of award, "N/A" will show on entry tag to show entry was judged and not overlooked.**

Best of Show ribbon (25 points) will be awarded as judge sees fit.

DIVISION 1: Decorative Design

(Best, 25; Blue, 20; Red, 15; White, 10)

Section 1: Tiny bouquet not over 5" tall

Section 2: An arrangement of your choice using either fresh or dried materials.

Section 3: Animal Critters - An animal made from fresh vegetables, fruits, nuts, seeds, etc. NO MAN-MADE MATERIALS.

Section 4: Creepy Critters - A figure of your imagination made from materials as listed in Section 3. NO MAN-MADE MATERIALS

DIVISION 2: Floriculture - Specimen Blooms

(Best. 25; Blue, 15; Red, 10; White 5, no points for white award in adults)

RULES:

1. When section calls for SPRAY, this is the branching portion of plant with 2 or more blooms open and showing color on a stem cut from main stalk.

2. When section calls for 3 BLOOMS, judges are looking for 3 as identically matched blooms as possible with all stems of same length.

3. Specimen blooms must have accompanying foliage except where noted.

Section 1: Asters, 3 blooms of each color

Section 2: Calendula, 3 blooms of each color

Section 3: Cosmos, 3 blooms of each color

Section 4: Chrysanthemum

Lot 1: 3 inches and over 1 bloom

Lot 2: Under 3 inches; 3 blooms or 1 spray

Section 5: Dahlias:

Lot 1: One bloom with NO buds and with one or more attached leaves

Lot 2: Three blooms with same type/color with leaves, no buds

Section 6: Daisies - 3 blooms of each color/kind

Lot 1: Gloriosa

Lot 2: Shasta

Lot 3: Any other type, 3 blooms or 1 spray

Section 7: Geraniums

Lot 1: Martha Washington, 1 spray each color

Lot 2: Zonal, 1 flower head with leaves

Lot 3: Ivy leaf, Scented, Other, 1 stem with leaves

Section 8: Gladioli, 1 spike of each color/kind, foliage not necessary

Section 9: House Plants

Lot 1: Flowering

Lot 2: Foliage

Section 10: Marigolds - No Buds

Lot 1: Large type, 1 bloom each color/kind

Lot 2: Dwarf type, 3 blooms each color and kind

Section 11: Nasturtium, 3 blooms each color/kind

Section 12: Pansies and violas - 3 blooms each color/kind

Section 13: Petunias - one spray each color & kind

Section 14: Phlox

Lot 1: Perennial, one stalk

Lot 2: Annual, 3 stems or 1 spray

Section 15: Roses

Lot 1: Tea Roses, one bloom each color and kind

Lot 2: Floribunda/Grandiflora, 1 spray

Lot 3: Climbing, 1 spray

Lot 4: Miniature, 1 spray or 1 single bloom

Section 16: Snapdragons, 3 stems each color/kind

Section 17: Sunflowers

Lot 1: Miniature

Lot 2: 3-5 inches

Lot 3: Over 5 inches

Section 18: Sweetpeas: 3 stems each color

Section 19: Strawflowers & ornamental grasses, 3 stems each color & kind. Ornamental grass in pots.

Section 20: Tuberous Flowers (Begonias, Cannas, Lilies, etc.) 1 Stem each color/kind

Section 21: Zinnias (need foliage):

Lot 1: Large type, one stem each color and kind

Lot 2: Dwarf and pom-pom, 3 stems each color & kind

Section 22: Baskets (must have handle). Minimum of 5 blooms. May mix or match colors or varieties. Natural fillers allowed.

Section 23: Planters, Dish gardens, Terrariums (NO FAKE FLOWERS)

Section 24: Other varieties not listed. For small specimens use three blooms each color and kind, or one spray if applicable.

Wild Flowers MUST be identified by name.

DIVISION 3: Fair Beautification

(Best, 50; Blue, 40; Red, 20; White, 10)

Judged on Decorative Design Score Card.

Section 1: Outside display using live materials in 1 or more tubs or planter boxes.

Section 2: Inside display. Decorative Display using inanimate objects (e.g., toys, figurines, antiques/memorabilia, etc.). Plants and/or flowers may be used in conjunction with display.

Exhibitors in Division 3 must first check with Department Superintendent to be sure room is available for inside displays.
