RULES:

1. Exhibitors shall read General Rules, Livestock Rules, Jr. Livestock Rules and Health Regulations before filling out entry blank.
2. All market lambs will be either wethers or ewes. NO RAMS and NO short scrotum rams will be allowed.
3. Lambs must show their lamb teeth.
4. Market lambs weighing over 150 lbs., will be judged in a separate class, but will **NOT** be eligible for Grand and Reserve Champion.
5. Minimum weight for market lambs is 100 lbs., lambs less than 100 lbs., will be judged in a feeder class, but are not eligible for the sale--only blue and red ribbon lambs will be eligible for the sale. Market lambs must weigh between 100 - 150 lbs.
6. All breeds and crossbreeds are eligible for Market Division.
7. All lambs must be shorn July 15 or later and not have more than 3/4" fleece length.
8. Market lambs may not enter any other class except Fitting and Showing.
9. Blanketing will be allowed before and during show days, Thurs.- Fri. After that, blankets must be removed for the public to view the animals.
10. In the breed classes, crossbreeds may enter lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13.
11. In the breed classes, sheep must be shown in an individual lot to be shown in group lots.
12. All sheep will be cleaned and fitted before show times.
13. **All lambs must have a USDA Scrapie tag to qualify for entry into any class.**
14. Each class of livestock will be judged separately by weight. Each division, 4-H, FFA and Open will be judged separately.

15. TAIL DOCKING POLICY--All Sheep shown at 4-H Youth shows should be docked in a manner that does not compromise the animal's health and well-being. As a working guideline we recommend that lambs be docked so that at the show the tail (dock) is long enough to be lifted. Moreover, the stress caused by docking increases with age, therefore docking should be performed early in life and certainly before the lambs are two weeks of age. The tail should be healed at the time of show and any animal that has been redocked, except for a medically justified reason should be ineligible for show. All lambs must be docked at the distal end of the caudal tail fold. (This is the policy of the American Veterinary Medical Association, the American sheep industry and the Washington State Sheep Producers).

Prime & Choice-superior conformation Blue
 Prime & Choice-less desirable conformation. **Red**
 Good Grade **White**

2. Animals will be placed within each ribbon group by the official judge.
3. Champions will be selected from market lambs only in blue ribbon groups to compete for Grand and

Reserve Grand champions.

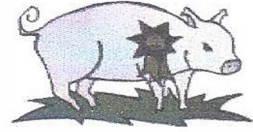

2. Hogs under 230 lbs will show in the feeder class and will not be eligible to sell. Any hogs over 300 lbs will go in heavy weight class and are not eligible for championship class.
3. No dogs in barn.
4. All hogs must have at least one bath BEFORE coming to the fair. No filthy hogs will be allowed to unload.
5. At the discretion of the Swine Superintendent any hog will be disqualified from the Show if it shows evidence of pigginess, scard, hernia, foul sheath, sores, bruises cryptorchidism, & blemishes that impair the carcass cut out.
