REGULAR MEETING OF THE LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD 8:00 P.M.
AT THE LINCOLN COUNTY COURTHOUSE.

MEMBERS PRESENT WERE: LARRY LINDBLOOM, BEA TEEL

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED.

BILLS WERE PRESENTED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2120.96. LARRY
MOVED AND R. M. PLOTTS SECONDED THAT THE BILLS BE ALLOWED.
MOTION CARRIED.

A REPORT WAS GIVEN BY LARRY ABOUT GOING TO THE CITY COUNCIL
ABOUT THE PENDING WATER PROBLEM. ANOTHER MEETING WILL HAVE TO
BE SCHEDULED BETWEEN FAIR REPRESENTATIVES AND THE CITY COUNCIL
OF WATER REPRESENTATIVES. R. M. MOVED THAT THE SAME COMMITTEE
LOOK INTO IT AS WENT THE FIRST TIME, THE MOTION SECONDED BY
FRED, AND MOTION CARRIED.

A REPORT WAS MADE AS TO THE MAKING OF THE NEW SIGNS NEEDED
FOR THE BUILDINGS. THE SIGNS PRICED AT SPOKANE WERE ENTIRELY
TOO HIGH SO DONNA WENT AHEAD AND NEGOTIATED SOME HELP IN GETTING
THEM MADE AT HOME.

CAL RANSOM (THE NEW EXTENTION AGENT) REPORTED ABOUT THE
PROGRESS OF THE LIVESTOCK SALE IN AS MUCH AS THE DAVENPORT AUTION
YARD DID NOT WANT TO TAKE IT THIS YEAR BECAUSE OF THE SLOW
PAYMENTS OF SOME OF THE BUYERS. THEY HAD TO KEEP THE ACCOUNT
OPEN TOO LONG AND LOST TOO MUCH MONEY ON THE LAMBS BECAUSE OF
THE WEIGHING.

CAL ALSO TALKED OF THE COMMISSIONERS WANTING TO TALK OF
MAKING A MEETING ROOM FOR THE EXTENTION AT THE FAIRGROUNDS
IN THE MAIN BUILDING. THIS WOULD BE FOR 4-H, AND SIMILAR
ASSOCIATED AGENCIES FROM THE EXTENTION SERVICES.

FRED MOVED WE CONTACT CHARLES LOHR OF AIRWAY HEIGHTS
TO COME TO THE FAIR FOR THE HEALTH INSPECTION. SECONDED BY
JOHN DEIFE AND MOTION CARRIED.


THE 4-H LADIES ASKED FOR THE HORSES TO BE CROSS TIED AT
THE FAIR SO HEAD WOULD BE OUT TO THE PUBLIC. IT WAS DISCUSSED
AND DECIDED THAT FOR SAFETY TO THE PUBLIC BECAUSE OF THE DISIGN
OF THE BARN, IT DOES NOT ALLOW THE STRENGTH TO HOLD HORSES.
FRED MOVED WE POSPONE UNTIL AFTER THE FAIR TO DISCUSS PREPARATION
FOR THE NEW OR REPAIRED BARN. THE MOTION SECONDED BY R. M. AND
MOTION CARRIED.

HERDSMANSHIP WAS DISCUSSED AND IT WENT TO THE PRESIDENT TO
APPOINT MEMBERS OF THE BOARD FOR JUDGING. NOTICE OF HERDSMANSHIP
WITH THE JUDGES WILL BE POSSED AT FAIR TIME FOR ANYONE WHO WANTS
TO TALK TO THEM ABOUT THE JUDGING.

LARRY [REDACTED] MOVED THAT EACH BOOTH PAYING \$35.00 FOR A SPACE WOULD
GET TWO WORKERS PASSES. SAME FOR THE CONCESSIONS, FOR EXCH \$35.00
GIVEN TO THE FAIR IN COMMISSION THEY COULD TAKE TWO PASSES OUT OF
WHAT THEY OWE THE FAIR. SECONDED BY JOHN DEIFE AND MOTION PASSES.

AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, LARRY MOVED THAT WE MOVE THE ENDING TIME OF THE FAIR BACK TO 6:00 P.M. BECAUSE OF THE CONTROVERCY. SECONDED BY JOHN DEIFE AND MOTION CARRIED.


R. M. MOVED THAT THE AGE OF SENIOR CITIZENS FOR THE GATE ADMISSION BE AT 62, THE STANDARD BREAKDOWN. DELOSS SECONDED AND MOTION CARRIED WITH NO FURTHER BUSINESS, THE MEETING ADJOURNED.
