

The regular meeting of the Lincoln County Fairboard was called to order by President, Bob Brooks, with 9 members present. The minutes of the last meeting were read with 2 corrections, 1. Parade time was changed to 11:00 instead of the scheduled 10:30, 2. should of read south restroom instead of north. A motion was made and seconded to approve the amended minutes. Motion carried.

Bills were presented in the amount of \$636.54. A motion was made and seconded to pay the bills. Motion carried.

At the special meeting of the Fair board, held Monday, February 6, the board decided to request assistance for 3 special projects. Them being additional lighting in the 4-H and Flower Building, lighting in the new horse barn, and the purchasing of 20 display cases to be used in the 4-H and Junior Building. A motion was made and seconded to apply for this assistance and carry through with the projects. Motion carried.

The board had also received a proposal from the Commissioners, asking for a spot for the Soil Testing Lab to rent. It was decided to suggest using the now janitors room, because of the availability of the water and drain needed by the lab. A motion was made and seconded to have Bob Brooks discuss this with the Commissioners and make the final decision that would be best suited for all parties involved. Motion carried.

Changes for the premium book were asked for by the secretary. John Wagner suggested that the score card that is printed in the book for judging the Grange Booths be eliminated from the premium book this year.


Phillip Brown has declined the contract offered by the FAir. It is not in his best interest now to refinish the floor and conduct roller skating at this time. However there are other possibilities for the refinishing of the floor. The different methods of refinishing will be looked into and presented at the next meeting.

Under new business, Tom Platt the area extension agent, offered a letter drawn up by the 4-H leaders and Ann Hennings, giving a proposal for the Superintendents of schools to look over conserning days absent from school for attending the Fair. Dennis Herdrick has been the spokesperson on this matter, and will go over the letter before it is sent on to the Superintendents.

A motion was made and seconded to have Bob Rambo present our special assistance projects to the State Fair Commissioners on Thur. Feb. 23, in Moses Lake. Motion carried.

Being no further business the meeting was ajourned, into an entertainment meeting to discuss different ideas for the Fair .
