LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

April 13, 1965

The meeting was called to order by President McKay, April 13, 1965, at the Extension building in Davenport.

Members present: James McKay, Dorothea Johnson, Ella Scheibner, Glenn Morrison, Mike Booker, Dick Whipple, and Katie Raugust

President McKay tried to acquaint the new board member, Mike Booker, with some of the problems and working procedures of the Fair.

Question asked in regard to using the Fair facilities for horses, etc., other than at Fair time. Discussion as to what would be a Fair charge for water and use of facilities. Mike Booker made a motion that a fee of \$4.00 per month be charged to keep one horse at the Fair Grounds, other than during Fair week. Seconded and carried.

Katie Raugust asked a question in regard to securing parade chairman. Dick Whipple had contacted Mel Jones to find out if he would take the Parade Chairmanship. Also Clair Reiha, both were not interested. Mel Jones was not very enthusiastic. Mike Booker to contact Jimmie Graham to find out if he would reconsider.

It is time to secure advertising for the Fair premium book. Those in charge of the various towns are: Almira, James McKay; Wilbur, Dorothea Johnson; Creston, Laurabelle Kunz; Waukon, Mrs. Wm. Peper; Edwall, E. M. Plotts; Reardan, Ralph Frisk; Harrington, Harold Jenkins, Joe Linstrum, Dick Harding; Sprague, Dick Whipple; Odessa, Roy Walter; Davenport, no one.

It was reported that John Elliott is ready to start on the cabinets for the flower building.

Livestock scale is in Spokane and will be picked up in the near future.

Ella Scheibner read a letter from Betty Heid (of the Davenport Schools) in regard to a place to exhibit for an Art Show during the Fair. Dorothea Johnson made a motion to grant the new Art Association permission to exhibit in the former canning and baking room of the main building provided no other area is available. Seconded by Katie Raugust. Carried.

April 13, 1965 (con't)

Mike Booker and Glenn Morrison reported on the possibilities of a track for quarter horses. President McKay appointed Mike Booker and Glenn Morrison on the Grounds committee, along with Dick Whipple, to contact Bill Hutsell and the County Engineer as to the area needed for different tracks that would be feasible.

Next meeting date to be Tuesday, May 4 at 8:00 p.m.

Discussion in regard to problems involved to finish the water project at the Fair Grounds. Decided to let ride for present so as to offset chance of having to pay for completed project at present and can use the \$5,000.00 for the track and horse facilities.

President McKay gave a report on the State Fair District meeting held at Wenatchee. State Fair meeting will be held at the Ridpath Hotel in Spokane, November 11 and 12.

Mrs. Raugust reported the fish barbeque dinner and the ice cream concession are still open. All the other concessions are taken throughout the County.

President McKay gave a report on the score sheet that Fairs are rated on.

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 8:35 p.m., May 4, 1965, by President McKay.

Members present: Laurabelle Kunz, Dorothea Johnson, Ella Scheibner, Roy Walter, James McKay, and Glenn Morrison

Minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

Discussion of size of building for serving pies and corn dogs. President McKay felt the 6 foot by 8 foot size recommended was too small. Discussion of purchasing a collapsible building. No action taken.

Glenn Morrison reported on the progress of the quarter mile track. There is not enough space available on our present grounds for this size track. Mike Booker and Glenn are to meet with Bill Hutsell about exchanging property to give the Fair enough room.

Glenn Morrison has the scales at his home. The Fair will need holding pens to be built before Fair time this fall. The State Scale Inspector will inspect scales free of charge.

Discussion of posters for advertising the Fair. Motion made by Dorothea Johnson, seconded by Ella Scheibner, that we order posters to advertise our Fair from Folger's Coffee. About 200 will be needed. Motion carried.
