Secretary to write Mrs. Johnson about getting the girls pictures taken free. Pictures taken could be as advertising the Studio. We could print a sign giving the studio credit for taking the pictures.

The Washington Water Power should check the wiring in the kitchen. Fuses are blowing when several units are used.

Les Seimer instructed to fix the floors in the dining room.

The directors felt another work day should be held in September.

A fan is needed for the hamburger stand. Motion made by Ella Scheibner, seconded by Katie Ragust, that we put a fan and hood in the hamburger stand.

Motion made by Roy Walter that the secretary write to all clubs that all Home Demonstration club booths will be judged together. Eliminating Class III, as erroneously listed in the Premium book. Seconded by Joe Linstrum. Carried.

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

July 8, 1964

The meeting was called to order July 8, 1964, at 8:30 p.m., in the Extension office, in Davenport, by President James McKay.

Present: James McKay, Joe Linstrum, Ella Scheibner, Dorothea Johnson, Glenn Morrison Richard Harding and Katie Raugust.

July 8, 1964 (con't)

President reported on the work day held earlier. They ran into trouble fixing the horse barn. All the rafters had to be straightened. Joe Linstrum reported that the step in front of the Grange booths was removed. A false wall in exhibit building for sewing displays was erected. Glenn Morrison reported the chicken barn is moved, but not permanently set. Discussion of fixing the chimney by a man named Bill Martin.

The pipe for the new water main was delivered July 3, 1964.

Discussion of dance bills for the coming Fair Queen dance. Motion made by Dorothea Johnson we have hand bills printed and sent to the different towns. Carried. Motion made by Joe Linstrum, that if there is not time to make the bills, that classified ads be sent to each Lincoln County paper. Carried.

The paying of taxes was discussed. Fairs have been advised ^{by} the State Fair Association to go slow in paying this back assessment. Tax man suggested we would not be subject to interest.

Discussion of work day. Possibility of July work day. Glenn will set work day for late July.

Katie Raugust discussed 75 year program to be celebrated this year. Suggested that the Fair should also observe this anniversary. Motion made by Ella Scheibner that Mrs. Raugust be chairman of the antique display and give her authority to appoint her own committee, and carry out as many of her ideas as possible. Seconded by Joe Linstrum. Carried.

Motion made by Richard Harding that all books be sent out by the Fair Secretary, instead of partly by the Fair Secretary and partly by the Extension office. Seconded and carried.

Discussion of race track. Suggested the track run north and south.


Secretary instructed to ask for \$6,000.00 in capital outlay in the budget for 1965, so that the arena may be fixed up. Labor budget category to be raised by \$100.00.


It was suggested we have Assistant County Engineer Donald Brown measure for $\frac{1}{4}$ mile track.

Meeting next time to be in August and the date will be set later.

Motion to adjourn after the meeting literally stopped with a bang---from the blowing up of one of the light fixtures near the table the Board was using.
