The Board decided to purchase blue and yellow signs for bumpers. Motion made by Ella Scheibner, seconded by Joe Linstrum, that we purchase 250 blue and yellow bumper stickers for advertising the fair.

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

June 9, 1964

The meeting was called to order by President James McKay at the Fair building, June 9, 1964, at 4:30 p.m.

Present: Roy Walter, Joe Linstrum, Glenn Morrison, Katie Raugust, Ella Scheibner, and James McKay

Also present: Naomi Walter, Rose Jenkins and Laura Hardt

Discussion of scales for the sale arena. President McKay reported that a new scale had been built for less than \$500.00 by friends of his. The scale was a Fairbanks-Morris scale.

Discussion of food concession. The Reardan clubs are interested. Mrs. Raugust reported that the hamburger concession was taken for all four days, but most of the others were still open.

Discussion of housing the horses. An open air shed with horses tied heads in, was considered the most suitable. Also discussion of track. It was thought the south end of the grounds would make a better track than where the arena is now.

Dorothea Johnson reported Mr. and Mrs. Corby Freeby of Harrington, will be the Chaperons for the Queen and her court. Mr. Freeby is president of the Harrington Bank.

Other improvements discussed that need to be done were the flower building. The walls should be finished, more step shelves for displaying flower exhibits, and extending the cement on one wall. It was approved that Les Seimer go ahead with building these steps. Three more are needed. Motion made by Roy Walter that Les Seimer be permitted to build these steps. Also that he paint them and the old ones, too. Carried.

Improvements to be made in the booth building. Paint in front of booths is needed. Motion made by Joe Linstrum that we paint the front of the booths all the same color. Seconded by Glenn Morrison. Carried. Guard rails in front of the booths to be installed. Suggested we run a cable from wall to wall with 2 posts for support.

Discussion of pictures of the Queen and her court. It was reported the girls have to pay \$5.00 for pictures that are on display at the Fair grounds. Secretary to write Mrs. Johnson about getting the girls pictures taken free. Pictures taken could be as advertising the Studio. We could print a sign giving the studio credit for taking the pictures.

The Washington Water Power should check the wiring in the kitchen. Fuses are blowing when several units are used.

Les Seimer instructed to fix the floors in the dining room.

The directors felt another work day should be held in September.

A fan is needed for the hamburger stand. Motion made by Ella Scheibner, seconded by Katie Ragust, that we put a fan and hood in the hamburger stand.

Motion made by Roy Walter that the secretary write to all clubs that all Home Demonstration club booths will be judged together. Eliminating Class III, as erroneously listed in the Premium book. Seconded by Joe Linstrum. Carried.
