March 9, 1965

The meeting was called to order at 1:45 p.m., March 9, 1965, by President James McKay, at the Extension office in Davenport.

Glenn Morrison reported on meeting with the Commissioners. We need more land for a 3/8 mile tract. This tract would be south of the cattle barns. No definite answer from the Commissioners in regard to assistance.

Joe Linstrum will not serve on the Board again, but he will be in charge of the Cattle sale and will be open Livestock Superintendent.

Discussion of obtaining judges. Letter read from the Extension office stating they do not wish to do this. Motion made by Laurabelle Kunz that the Extension office in cooperation with the superintendents should obtain judges. Seconded and carried.
