President Plotts read Inspector's report of 1970 Fair.

Discussion on his report followed. Felt not all items were fair.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and carried.

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

April 12, 1971

The meeting of the Lincoln County Fair Board was called to order by President R. M. Plotts at 8:10 p.m., April 12, 1971, in the Extension Office in Davenport.

Present: R. M. Plotts, Donna Christensen, Bea Teel, Clarence Wagner, W. James McKay, John E. Deife, and Secretary Verna Johns.

Also present: Sharon Ames, John Sawyer, Art Deppner, Larry Lindbloom-Jerry Newcomb, Leslie Seimer, Keith Schultz and Mike Booker/

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Representatives of the Lions Club met with the Fair Board to discuss the Carnival at the 1971 Fair. We lost points in rating for the 1970 Fair because of lack of concessions for teen-agers as well as younger children. Edwall Lions Club will have Sno Cone Concession at the coming Fair.

Larry Lindbloom and Jerry Newcomb met with the Fair Board to discuss the rodeo planned to be held August 20 and 21. Discussed a building size

10' x 20' to be used as a refreshment concession near the grand stand. Jerry Newcomb discussed the VFW building this building and the Fair to receive 5% of the net profit on the sales from this refreshment stand. Mr. Wagner suggested the Fair taking no money until the building is paid for. Motion made by Mr. Wagner that with the VFW furnishing their own crowd and most of their own facilities the Fair ask only 5% of the net with the understanding that we will have use of the concession stand built by the VFW during the Fair. Seconded by Mr. Deife. Carried. The VFW would like permission to start putting up some of the bucking shoots for the rodeo. This permission was granted. Also asked if any ground would be available for a miniature golf course.

Discussion of the need of repairing the doors on the main building; especially on the East side. No action taken.

President Plotts reported on hearing from Don Moos and said we did not have to worry about charging a gate or loosing Pari-Mutual funds. Read an estimate of \$3,700.00 plus sales tax and nails from August Schmauder for refinishing the floor in the main building. No action taken.

Motion made by Donna Christensen that Mr. Plotts write a letter asking our representative not to add any amendments to HB 787. Seconded by Mr. McKay. Carried.

The President reported our fair received 616 points on score sheet based on the Inspector's report out of a possible 1,000 points.

Mike Booker met with the Board in regard to selling a set of jumps and trail ride set ups for \$150.00. Motion made by Clarence Wagner, that we purchase these for the Fair. Seconded by Mr. McKay. Carried.

President Plotts read information about fence, and estimated a cost of about \$3,000.00.

Discussion of containers or contest for flowers for beautification. Suggested we should set a minimum standard of 3 square feet and give one dollar (\$1.00) for an entry. Motion made by Clarence Wagner that we have two (2) classes, one in 4-H and one in Open Class, and give awards of first place, \$15.00; second place, \$10.00; and third place, \$5.00 for each class. Seconded by Donna Christensen. Carried.

Motion made by Clarence Wagner that we call for bids for fencing the fairgrounds. Seconded by Bea Teel. Carried.

Discussion of some on to do the clerking for Market Livestock Sale. Also should have some way of getting market checks to exhibitors.

Motion made by Bea Teel, seconded by Donna Christenson, that we accept the changes for the 4-H Home Economics Department that have been submitted. Carried.

The Board gave Larry Brown permission to use the arena and dining room if necessary June 29th for 4-H Horse School.

Motion made by Bea Teel to adjourn. Seconded by Donna Christensen. Carried.
