

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

June 7, 1971

The meeting of the Lincoln County Fair Board was called to order by President R. M. Plotts at 8:30 p.m., June 7, 1971, in the Extension Office at Davenport.

Present: Donna Christianson, R. M. Plotts, Clarence Wagner, W. James McKay, Bea Teel, John E. Deife and Secretary Verna Johns

Also present: Art Deppner, John Sawyer, Bruce Kintschi, Keith Schultz

Discussion of ~~Lisense~~- Lions Club having carnival concession. Davenport Lions will have cotton candy, pop corn, cat throw, bingo; Reardan Lions to have rides and Edwall Lions club to have Sno-cones.

Minutes of the last meeting read, corrected and approved.

Bea Teel reported on prices of obtaining utensils for the kitchen. Checked at two restaurant supply houses in Spokane, C & C Restaurant Supplies and Brodie's Supply. Brodie is the cheapest and the total cost of what we need would come to about \$179.00 without tax. Motion made by Clarence Wagner, seconded by Donna Christianson that Bea be authorized to purchase these items for kitchen. Carried.

Donna Christianson reported the Horse Collar in Harrington would buy the eight (8) old coffee pitchers at \$25.00. Motion made by Bea Teel, seconded by Mr. McKay we accept this offer. Carried.

Secretary reported on tearing down the old hog shed. It was decided the best way to have it removed was to have the City Fire Department burn this building down.

Les Seimer is to tear out old fence and receive \$2.00 per hour for this work in addition to his regular monthly salary. This work should take about 8 or 9 hours.

Discussion of checking accuracy of the scales. Larry Brown said last year the State Weight Inspector checked the scales and said they were just within the allowable limits. Suggested Correll Scales Service be contacted in Spokane to have them checked this year.

Letter read from Mrs. John Kunz of Wilbur stating Gail Eagle will be Wilbur Fair Princess.

Letter read from Mrs. Chester Peterson of Edwall, Floriculture Superintendent requesting changes for this year's premium list. Changes were accepted by the Fair Board and Secretary instructed to make these changes in this year's premium book.

Bea Teel reported Parlor 'n Patio Club booth wish to sell Mexican food in their booth from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Discussed whether it would meet health standards and if wiring were adequate. Fair Board instructed Bea to tell them this and tell them they might be able to use VFW building ~~in~~ when and if it is built.

President Plotts reported on bid opening for fencing the fairgrounds. Six sets of bid plans sent out, but only 2 bids received. Allied Industrie Inc., Spokane in the amount of \$4,942.35 and Ralph's Fence Company of Veradale in the amount of \$4,845.75. The bid was for 1,980 feet of fencing

including the barb wire at the top.

Clarence Wagner reported Bill Hutsell will be Auctioneer at the Live-stock Sale.

Clarence brought up that the Reardan Livestock Preview would like to use the fairgrounds free of charge as long as grounds are cleared up afterwards. Motion made to this effect by Clarence, seconded by Mr. McKay. Carried.

Les Seimer reported that all food concessions are spoken for.


Still need Superintendents for the following: Dairy; Kiddie's Parade; Poultry and Rabbits.

Les Seimer reported grass needed cutting. He had taken the glass out of container in the 4-H building. Also said he had looked at the door situation on the East side and felt a third door wouldn't help the traffic congestion.

Motion made by Clarence WAgner, seconded by Bea Teel we adjourn at 10:30 p.m. Carried.

July 12, 1971
