#### LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

March 13, 1972

The Lincoln County Fair Board meeting was called to order by President R. M. Plotts, Monday, March 13, 1972 at 8:10 p.m., in the Extension Office at Davenport.

Present: R. M. Plotts, John Wagner, W. James McKay, Bill Bailey, John E. Deife, Donita Linstrum, Roberta Archer and Secretary Verna Johns.

Also present: Fred Springer, Leslie Seimer, Sharon Ames, Lawrence Brown, and Glenn Swanson of Jet Air Spray Co.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Swanson explained his product, that of Jet Air Spray Company to make one's own signs. His lowest priced sign making machine costs \$295.00. No action taken on purchasing of this machine.

Sharon Ames presented the 4-H changes for the 1972 premium list. Motion made by John Wagner, seconded by Mrs. Archer that these changes be accepted. Carried.

Discussion of various chairmen still needed for the fair this year. Fred Springer to be the FFA Department Chairman.

4-H Horse Club changes received for this year's premium book.

Secretary Verna Johns reported the Lincoln County Fair received \$11,250.00 in pari-mutual funds this year. Also said the premium list was ready for the printers, but not the ads as not all the ads were in. Secretary instructed to make the changes in the 4-H and Horse premium

Letter was read from the Department of Agriculture regarding health requirements for the 1972 Fair.

President Plotts read a letter from Roger Roberts stating it was not the State Fair policy to send out evaluation sheets and State Fair Inspector's reports. However, he did receive a percentage rating sheet.

Secretary to order bumper stickers as in previous years. Discussion of ribbons for this year's Fair. Secretary Verna Johns instructed to order needed as she has done in previous years. It was decided that all ribbons are to be UNDATED.

A head-stock for use in putting an identification tag in ear of livestock was needed reported Mr. Springer. No action taken.

Mr. Springer suggested Reardan Livestock preview be allowed to be held at the Fairgrounds April 15, 1972. Board gave approvable for this.


Leslie Seimer reported pipes are needing repairs in the main building. No action taken.

John Wagner brought up the problem of the Public Address System. Clarence Wagner got information regarding this last year and it was suggested John could contact him to see what information he had been able to obtain.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn.
