

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

October 11, 1971

The meeting of the Lincoln County Fair Board was called to order by President R. M. Plotts at 8:10 p.m. Monday, October 11, 1971 in the Extension Office in Davenport.

Present: R. M. Plotts, Bill Bailey, John Wagner, W. James McKay, Mrs. Roberta Archer, John E. Deife and Secretary Verna Johns.

Also present: Sharon Ames, Les Seimer, Bea Teel, Vern Anderson

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Letter read from the Wes Blys' regarding mix-up of duties. Answer of explanation written by the Secretary in reply to their letter. Final letter read from the Blys acknowledging and accepting explanation. Vice President Deife complimented the Secretary on the very well written letter to the Blys.

President Plotts reported Mr. Deife and Mr. McKay on the committee to meet with the Commissioners regarding the final budget hearing as he will not be here.

Pres. Plotts read recommendations by the Horse people in their meeting held September 21. Also read minutes of the meeting of the Livestock people held September 22.

September 27 meeting reviewing the fair discussed. Mr. Deife reported \$189.75 was made on Saturday night Fair dance.

Bev Schultz has resigned as Open Sewing Superintendent. Helen (Mrs. Don) Jantz recommended to replace her. Seats around poles would be nice if mid-way is paved. Also move fair office to more central location.

Roberta Archer spoke of need to improve the Public Address system for the Arena program.

Discussion of dumping garbage. Fair was criticized by the City for the mess at the dump grounds.


Letter from Gordon Marsh of Grandview saying he hoped to show here another year.


Vern Anderson of Edwall met with the Board regarding the ~~Lisen~~ Lions Club Carnival Concession. Mr. Anderson said some of the Lions clubs are losing interest and those left cannot handle a large show. The building that people work in is not large enough. Lighting is also inadequate.

Elections of officers: R. M. Plotts was nominated as President. Secretary instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Plotts for President. John E. Deife nominated as Vice President. Motion made by Mr. McKay Secretary be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Deife as Vice President. Verna Johns re-appointed Secretary-Treasurer.

John E. Deife nominated as delegate to the State Convention at Richland at Hanford House on November 11 and 12, 1971 as President will be on a trip to the South Seas. Mr. Deife elected delegate to State Convention.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn. Carried.
