Reported fencing contract was paid August 2, 1971 to Ralph's Fencing Company in the amount of \$4,971.75. The Fair Board approved the 1972 preliminary budget prepared by the Secretary and accepted her Treasurer's report.

Bea Teel reported all utensils have been received for the kitchen; have been marked Lincoln County Fair and are at the Fair Building. Also reported Marlene Overmyer of Reardan will take charge of the Kiddie's Parade.

Chuck Plumb said he would arrange a Fly-Over during the Parade of jet planes. He is to contact Larry Whiteside to make arrangements for this.


Chuck Plumb would like to take pictures of exhibitors and exhibits at the Fair and then have them for sale.

LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

September 6, 1971

The meeting of the Lincoln County Fair Board was called to order by President R. M. Plotts, Monday, September 6, 1971 at 8:15 p.m. in the Extension Office at Davenport.

Present: Bea Teel, Donna Christianson, Les Wilcox, R. M. Plotts, Vivienne Schultz, Clarence Wagner, W. James McKay and Secretary Verna Johns.

Also present: Lawrence Brown, Les Seimer

Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved.

President Plotts mentioned some of the items discussed at the superintendent's meeting held September 1. Exhibits to be eligible for Fair beautification award must be growing plants, not cut flowers.

Larry Brown suggested Monday, September 27, 1971, as Evaluation meeting rather than September 20, as suggested at the previous meeting. This change was approved.

Clarence Wagner told of checking into the Public Address system. Cost of any good system would be at least \$500.00. Mobile-walkie-talkie system should be cheaper and would do a good job.

Arnold James of Chelias will be State Fair Inspector this year.

Elmer Houck of Harrington is to be Poultry and Rabbit Superintendent. Hours suggested he be there to receive entries are 6 - 9 p.m. Wednesday, and at 7:30 until 9:00 a.m. on Thursday.

Discussion of bill from A & D Welding for bucket on Mike Booker's tractor and bill to REA for carbon bits. Motion made by Clarence Wagner, seconded by Bea Teel, that bills be paid and letter written to Mike asking him to bring to the Fairgrounds and deliver to Les Seimer. These items are for the Fair's use. Carried.

August Schmauder's bill of \$251.90 was paid in August. This was for fixing doors and frames.

Discussion of what percentage should be charged Parlor and Patio for Mexican Food Concession. Motion made by Donna Christianson, seconded by Vivienne Schultz, that we ask 15% of gross for this concession. Much discussion followed regarding having only one percentage rate, rather than two rates as we now ask. Motion amended by Donna we ask 15%, including the ice cream concession, on all concessions starting with the present year, 1971. Seconded by Vivienne. Carried.

Discussion of out-of-county market lambs entered in the Sheep Division/ President Plotts to speak to exhibitor about this.

President Plotts reported on Chick Portable Toilets for livestock area.

Cancelled checks for sale will now come to Secretary. They will not be part of the Revolving Fund.

It was reported the old snow fence was sold to Bill Nicholls for \$8.00.

Motion to adjourn made by Vivienne Schultz, seconded by Bea Teel at 10:15 p.m. Carried.
