

SEPTEMBER 20, 1978

REGULAR MEETING OF THE LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD WAS HELD AT THE COURTHOUSE AT 8:00 P.M. WITH JOHN WAGNER AS PRESIDENT. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED.

REPORT WAS MADE BY R. M. PLOTTS AS TO THE RESULTS OF THE HERDSMANSHIP IN THE HORSE AREA AND TRIGERED MUCH DISCUSSION OF THE MANNER IN WHICH THE AWARDS WERE CHOSEN. MORE STUDING NEEDS TO BE DONE IN THIS AREA. FRED MADE A SUGGESTION THAT THE EXTENTION BE ASKED FOR IDEAS AS TO HOW TO PROCEED WITH THIS MATTER.

R. M. MOVED AND FRED SECONDED THAT THE BILLS PRESENTED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,500.87 BE ALLOWED. MOTION PASSED.

IN DISCUSSION OF THE PENDING FAIR CONVENTION, FRED MOVED THAT THE MANAGER, PRESIDENT AND ANY OTHER BOARD MEMBERS SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO GO IN LIGHT OF THE FINANCES BEING ABLE TO HANDLE SEND THEM. SECONDED BY BOB MARTIN AND MOTION CARRIED.

FRED REPORTED THAT THE LIVESTOCK SALE WENT WELL INSIDE THE BUILDING AND SUGGESTED THAT WE MAYBE DO IT AGAIN NEXT YEAR. HE ALSO THOUGHT SOMETHING SHOULD BE DONE WITH THE LAMB SALE BECAUSE WE WERE TAKING IT IN THE EAR BECAUSE OF THE LOSS IN WEIGHT DURING SHIPPING.


ALSO A NOTE FOR NEXT YEAR, THE BRAND INSPECTOR NEEDS TO BE HERE ON FRIDAY INSTEAD OF THURSDAY NIGHT. TO SAVE CONFUSION.


