It was suggested that rabbits need to be restricted to four per exhibitor because of space available, and as many carry-On's as wish for the Fitting and Showing on Saturday. The motion was made by Fred Springer and seconded by Bob O'Neil, motion parsed.

The Secretary was instructed to get a dance bank for the July dance of the Fair Queen and her court. The tickets are to be \$"2.00 a single and 3.00 a couple.
