JUNE 17, 1992
MEETING MINUTES

At 7:45 PM the meeting was called to order. Interviews for fair secretary were conducted. Ann Fillion was hired for the 1992 fair season. She will start June 29th.

The minutes from the May 20, 1992 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurers Report Gerry reviewed the budget status and revenue reports. At the end of May we had a cash balance of \$23,010.76. Gerry also reviewed bills that had been submitted for payment in June and those that will be paid in July.

Grounds & Maintenance Howard has been working with Travis on the grounds and painting some signs. The Edwall Centennial Committee will pick up benches and standards on the 18th at 9 AM. Howard will purchase some Roundup to use on buttonweed in the arena.

Breathing Supers Reported that they do not have supers for Rabbits or Chickens. Dale Erickson has agreed to be the veterinarian for the '92 fair.

Non Breathing Supers A meeting was held June 18th for all supers that reviewed duties and the new point calculation system.

Parade Lanny reported that he has had 7 returns on invitations. He received an OK to pay mileage for the MC of the parade. He still needs 2 judges.

Premium Book - The book will be printed by the Wilbur Register. Parks Print turned in a bid of \$2,679.00, Davenport Times \$1,892.50 and Wilbur Register \$2,050.00. Wilbur Register was not the lowest bid but he has offered the use of his bulk mailing rate which will offset the higher bid, so we were able to go with the Wilbur Register.

June minutes

Food Celeste reported that the price of salmon for the barbeque will likely be a little lower this year. The Boy Scouts have agreed to serve and prepare food for that event for \$100, the same price as last year. The Lincoln Co United Methodist Men's group will prepare a dinner Saturday night. The Cottonwood will provide lunch on Friday and Saturday. Linda had questions about the health permit requirements for the groups serving pies. There also seemed to be some question about the rental amount to charge for the hamburger stand.

Old Business We have not been able to located a trailer for a portable stage. The hog and sheep pens are being painted and latches put on by Joan Edwards.

New Business Orville is looking for paint for the barn project - it has been gutted. Loren Reinbold will bring granite for the floor on Saturday. Gerry is getting lumber and supplies for all the projects. Arena lighting - Rod's Electric and Aztec Electric will be sending estimates. We can get 35' poles from Lincoln Electric Cooperative for \$187.00 each, we need 2. The fixtures will cost \$4200.

Christian Heritage Cheerleaders will be the ticket takers.

We discussed the possiblity of charging extra for Baxter Black. No decision was made.

Bob noted that in the state evaluation we should be emphasizing recycling and having prominent displays of the prime agricultural element in our county. Howard reported that we have 11 recycling bins and we are in need of more trash barrels.

The carnival contract has been signed and returned.

Bob reported that he has been contacting Lions Clubs in Lincoln County for donations to bring the Reptile Exhibit to the Fair. He has received a committment of \$100 from Wilbur and \$150 from Reardan.

It was determined that FFA Groups from Stevens Co can show in open class events.

There have been several fair news releases in the Lincoln County newspapers.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:35 PM.
