LINCOLN COUNTY FAIR BOARD MINUTES

September 9, 1969

The meeting of the Lincoln County Fair Board was called to order by President McKay at 8:15 p.m., September 9, 1969, at the Extension office in Davenport.

Present: Mike Booker, Clarence Wagner, John E. Deife, Les Wilcox, Vivienne Schultz, James McKay, Ed Young, R. M. Plotts, Bea Teel

Also present: Leslie Seimer, Randall Darling

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

President McKay reported on some parts of the Fair. He felt the support price was too high above the floor price. Many compliments on improvements in flower building. Mr. Bert Brown, the State Fair Inspector, did not say much, but complimented us on the 4-H building, flower building, and said the floor was so clean in the 4-H cattle barn, he could have eaten off of it.

The Odessa Riding Club, who had the hamburger concession, questioned the 20% of gross profits. They felt this was too high.

Mr. Plotts reported Ruth Duenwald, Republican County party chairman, felt they should not have to pay for use of the booth as they were a Civic organization.

Discussion of storing community floats in the fair buildings during the winter. Reardan has asked if they may store their float during the winter. Motion by Mike Booker, seconded by Bea Teel, that community floats may be stored free of charge. Carried.

September 9, 1969 (con't)

Mike Booker reported on livestock problems. Said each stall was left dirty and this made a great deal of work for our maintenance man. Suggested as each exhibitor leaves, he cleans the stall of his animal. This would leave just one pile for the maintenance man to clean up, rather than all the barns.

Bea Teel reported on problems of serving in the main dining hall. We need more silverware. Suggested we raise the price of the Salmon Barbecue as the price of salmon has jumped and we just broke even this year. Motion by John Deife, seconded by Lex Wilcox, we set the price of the barbecue at \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children, 12 and under. Carried.

It was reported the Odessa Riders' Club would like the hamburger concession again next year (1970). Motion by Vivienne Schultz, seconded by Bea Teel, we give the hamburger concession to the Odessa Riders' Club in 1970. Carried.

It was suggested a water fountain is needed some place on the grounds.


Orville and Mike Taylor were night watchman again this year. They are to receive the same pay as last year, \$40.00 each.

It was reported tree trimmers are cutting out and trimming trees at the Courthouse and the wood is being given to those who ask for it. This wood would be good to use for the Salmon Barbecue. Les Seimer instructed to get wood at the Courthouse while it is available.
